## **REALIGNMENT PROJECT COMPLETION**



Reconfiguration of Lemon Grove Ave. and North near State Route 94, included new landscaping with new sidewalks creating an easy path between the Promenade Park, the Trolley, and North Avenue. All overhead utilities were undergrounded and improved stormwater treatment. With the final safety measures in place for the Lemon Grove Realignment Project., updated signage, signaling, and striping direct traffic in a manner designed to incorporate an essential right-of-way rail signaling system, street lights, and pedestrians. This highly complex project is critical for the residents of Lemon Grove, and the thousands of pedestrians that utilize the Orange Line Light Rail system in San Diego.

Traffic operations adjacent to railroad grade crossings is a very complex design that must incorporate train, vehicle, and pedestrian safety. Traffic signals are interconnected with train-activated warning systems at locations near North and Lemon Grove Ave. The State Public Utilities Commission and Federal Railroad standards outline specific guidelines for rail-road crossings at traffic signal intersections. The normal operation of the traffic signals controlling the intersection should be "preempted" to operate in a special control mode when trains are approaching. When activated, strict guidelines dictate that a "track clearance interval must occur to clear any potential vehicle from the tracks upon the arrival of an approaching train. Once the track clearance is complete, the intersection transitions into "limited service", where again, in the interest

of safety the federal rail authority does not allow any vehicle movement that would send motorists towards the tracks, even with railroad gates down. Consequently, train approaches interrupt the normal cycling of the traffic signal at both Lemon Grove and North Ave intersections.

The City would like to thank all the residents, businesses, and motorists for their patience and understanding as city engineers worked to get the project within safety guidelines.

## "IT'S LIKE **PAINTING THE SURFACE** OF THE MOON"

For many, the Lemon is a work of art, but for tourists, it presents the best opportunity for a selfie in the, "Best Climate on Earth". The public sculpture simply known as "the Big Lemon," has become a must see item in San Diego County and serves as a famous iconic symbol in the City of Lemon Grove.

The sizable fruit was originally built as a parade float on July 4, 1928 and later plastered before being placed upon an engraved concrete base reading, "The Best Climate on Earth."

Recently, the City's most sought-after landmark, the infamous sculpture became the target for vandalism prompting city officials to contact the original restoration artist and Lemon Grove resident, Mr. Steven Garcia. Mr. Garcia has lived in Lemon Grove since 1976 and has been active in the community for over 30 years as an artist and professional stuntman.

A skilled artist, Mr. Garcia approaches the project with a passion for painting and restoration.
